BALLACHULISH FIREWORKS

As many of you will have read in the Oban Times: The Ballachulish Community regret to announce that we will be unable to hold our annual Fireworks Display in Ballachulish Quarry for 2017.

In January this year, the Highland Council instigated a requirement for all such events to have a Public Entertainment Licence, with an Event Management Plan, which has resulted in much more onerous licensing requirements that were not previously required for small community events. We have been looking at all of the paperwork for over a year and have sadly concluded that the additional requirements, both in terms of associated costs and additional man-hours make it impossible to continue at the present time to meet the Highland Council Time Frame for licenced events this year.

The Fireworks have been a great community event over the last decade, and we would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has been involved in helping to organise the event, and also all of you who have come and enjoyed the display over the years. We are still considering our options for 2018 and hope to be able to hold a replacement event of some form, although at this point in time it is unlikely to be a fireworks display.



VILLAGE HALL NEWS

Cycling Time Trials

The Cycling Time Trials 10th anniversary in honour of the late Jason MacIntyre from Fort William was held on May 14th, based at the hall. This was the first time ever held in Scotland as historically they are always held south of the border. Over 70 riders male and female participated in the event, having travelled from as far afield as the Isle of Man. Fastest rider home, having cycled round Loch Leven was Archibald with an astounding time of 38 minutes 40seconds. The organisers were very complimentary about what Ballachulish had to offer, were 'blown away' by the scenic route of the ride around the Loch and plans are

currently ongoing to make this an annual event which has the potential to be a massive economic boost to the area. The Jason MacIntyre Memorial Trophy was awarded to the fastest rider by Jason's widow Caroline and her daughters in the hall afterwards where Jason memorabilia was on display including his bike which had not been seen in public in ten years.



BALLACHULISH GODDESS

Oover 2000 years ago the wooden statue now known as the Ballachulish Goddess was lost in peatbog near Alltschellach House, North Ballachulish. This summer, from $3^{\rm rd}-5^{\rm th}$ August, an experimental Archaeology Group from Ireland, working with Northlight Heritage in Glasgow will be attempting to create a replica of the Goddess, using replica tools and methods.

Plans are still being finalised, but will be roughly as follows:

- Thursday Evening presentation event at village hall
- Friday and Saturday 10-4 Carving of the figurine and demonstrations at the Quarry (or hall if bad weather) using replica tools and techniques.
- Saturday evening It is hoped to take the figurine back to the discovery site at North Ballachulish.

of the locations? And will there be a second series?





Travel Immunisations – Seek Advice Early!

Provision of travel health advice and immunisations is done by the Practice Nurse, Zoe. You can also get travel advice from chemists (including online) and specialist travel clinics. Provision of travel health advice is being reviewed across Scotland and may be taken away from GP practices in the future.

For now if you need travel health advice and want to get that from the GP surgery you need to book an appointment with the Practice Nurse, as early as possible to discuss where you are going, review your medical notes and agree with you what immunisations or medication may be required. We do not stock travel immunisations or malaria tablets as we have limited capacity for storage and they can go out of date. If you do need vaccines you will be given a prescription to take to the chemist, and appointments to come back for your vaccines. As some vaccines are given over the course of several months it is really important that you come for travel advice as soon as possible. Don't leave it too late and risk going overseas unprotected. A really useful website is fitfortravel.co.uk it is run by Health Protection Scotland - it uses all the same guidance and research that the Practice will do. It is important before you come for your travel appointment to come in with an itinerary of where and when you are going to help the risk assessment. Leaving it too late to seek travel advice is not an emergency, if you cannot be seen routinely you will be asked to seek private travel health advice from another provider. Furthermore if we are seeing you for travel we need to do an assessment before we can prescribe any immunisations, we do not take anyone else's say so for what is required - it would be irresponsible and unsafe of us to do that.

All travel advice and immunisation requires a booked appointment of the appropriate length. There is no charge for travel advice, however some vaccines and malaria medication are considered 'private' and will be charged for by the chemist and a private prescription fee of £15 per item is paid to the Practice. If you are not sure what is provided by the NHS and what is paid for you can ask at your travel health appointment.

NEWS FROM ST MUNDA'S CHURCH OF SCOTLAND

Duror and St Munda's Parish Church

Our churches continue to support Re-Act (Lochaber and Argyll) who work to help refugees in this country and abroad. St Munda's Church is a collection point for donations and volunteers are frequently at the local distribution point in Caol helping to sort donations. Requirements change from time to time and we publish updated lists. Recently, under the slogan 'Coming to Church isn't a Pain' we collected over 75 packets of painkillers which went as part of a shipment to a refugee camp in Yemen.

In our support for Christian Aid 'Munda's Men' collected an amazing £1075 for their sponsored walk of the West Highland Way and Duror Church raised well over £500 at their Christian Aid lunch. After the service on 25th June, with sandwiches and loads of homebaking, we enjoyed a slide-show with commentary on the experiences of 'Munda's Men' on their walk. That service was made extra special with contributions from our Praise Band who also led the congregation in some modern hymns.

The church supports the Ballachulish Youth Club with the minister there every week and another volunteer starting to get involved. Two of us recently attended a meeting in Fort William which discussed the possibility of starting a Street Pastor service there.

Our churches are open during the day partly to allow visitors to the area to enjoy them but also for anyone to come in and spend some guiet time. Scriptural and spiritual materials are being developed to offer some thoughts to guide private prayer or contemplation.

This being holiday time we're enjoying having visitors from around the UK as well as Germany, USA, Holland, Australia and probably other places too. 

MRS MALLOCH'S SPINNING WHEEL

One of the best things about working in a museum is learning about the history of our objects; finding out about the people behind them, and being able to share their stories. That is exactly what happened when one of our visitors from New Zealand shared this wonderful image with us recently.

The picture features Alexandrina Malloch, who was the proprietress of the Kings House Hotel during the Second World War and a relative of our New Zealand visitor. Mrs Malloch used to do spinning demonstrations outside the Kings House for tourists. Our visitor had been told by family members that the spinning wheel pictured was on display in Glencoe Folk Museum, and so decided to come and see it for herself while visiting the area. The spinning wheel has been in our collections for years with no record of its



provenance apart from the name of the donor: Mrs Cameron. Our visitor recognised Mrs Cameron as Mrs Malloch's daughter, and so we were able to reunite our old spinning wheel with its past!
