BALLACHULISH MEDICAL PRACTICE

PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP Pulling together for health

My name is Pauline Selby and I am currently the Secretary of the Ballachulish Medical Practice Patient Participation Group. We aim to be a liaison between the public and the medical staff at our surgery.

We are arranging a Health and Wellbeing Day, at the local Village Hall on Friday 11th October, from 10.00 hrs. until 16.00 hrs. We hope to have as many groups represented as possible. The event will be advertised throughout our medical practice area and we feel this will be an

ideal opportunity to make the public aware of your organisation. The aim of the event is for the local community to become aware of just how many resources

& activities there are in the area, to offer help and support in many ways, aiming to inspire people to take better care of their own health. Also, it might encourage people to volunteer for your groups.

DUROR AND ST MUNDA'S PARISH CHURCH OF SCOTLAND

Over the summer, in addition to the ongoing support for refugees through 'Lochaber Supports Refugees', we made a special collection of toiletries and men's underwear to go to a refugee camp. The list of items gathered included 65 items of underwear, 20 pairs of socks, 120 bars of soap, 142 tooth brushes and a lot more. This collection was completed on the last Sunday of August, taken to a distribution depot at Muir of Ord on the Tuesday and the next day was en-route to Syria.

Before the end of term Ballachulish School pupils were given a letter and told about the Mary's Meals 'Backpack Project'. This project recognises that many of the children who receive 'Mary's Meals' don't have the basics for learning such as pencils, notepads and P.E. kit. We're still hoping to get more donations of school bags in reasonable condition which can be brought to the school or church then we'll encourage church members or anyone in the community to donate stationery articles or children's P.E. kit items to fill them. 'Mary's Meals' will arrange to transport them to appropriate schools.

'What's So Amazing About Grace?' From Wednesday 25th September (7.00pm in Duror Church hall) we'll have roughly weekly sessions thinking about this question with a DVD intro from the author, Philip Yancey, and other contributors. The sessions will switch between Duror and St Munda's and be on different days and different times of day so that people should manage to at least some meetings. Anyone is welcome and tea and coffee will be served.

Hamish Brown, climber, traveller and author will give a talk at St Munda's Church on Wednesday 23rd October at 7.00 pm telling the story of his family who were caught in Japan at the outbreak of the Second World War in the Pacific. He'll bring to life not only the dying days of the British Empire but also the terrible reality of the invasion of Singapore into which the family had escaped.

Abbeyfield Ballachulish, the independent local charity that provides a range of services for older people, is celebrating receiving an overall "Excellent" Grade 6, the highest grade possible for the ninth year running, following a recent unannounced inspection by the Care Inspectorate; one of only 10 to achieve this in the UK.

Abbeyfield Ballachulish relies on fund raising through the local community, grant funding, local business support and partnership working with NHS Highland, and strives to provide local services that meet the needs of the community. Abbeyfield is currently planning to expand its much needed services and needs to raise £400,000 to convert part of the building to provide an additional eight care beds.

BALLACHULISH PRIMARY SCHOOL UPDATE

As many of you are aware, The Highland Council have recently concluded a review of the management of the local schools. The final outcome is that Kinlochleven Primary and High Schools will become a 3-18 campus with a single Headteacher, while at this end of the Loch the four schools will be put in to two 2-school clusters, Ballachulish and Duror in one and Glencoe and St Brides in the other.

Our current head teacher, Carol Divers, has decided not to apply for a cluster head role and Marilyn MacDonald, who was previously overseeing the other three schools, has retired. Ainslie Burns has been appointed as headteacher for Ballachulish and Duror, but will cover Glencoe, Duror and St Brides in the interim, with a new appointment to be made for Glencoe and St Brides in the near future. Carol Divers remains in post as Head of Ballachulish Primary until the new post is filled.

However, the Parent Council, which represents all parents and carers who have a child enrolled at the school, have concerns about the processes and outcomes of the Review and is currently looking at ways of challenging Highland Council's decisions, seeking support from our MP and MSPs.

- The Parent Council is concerned that the interests and well-being of pupils and staff at our schools have not been forefront of the Review process.
- Communication has been very poor between Highland Council and parent representatives regarding plans for the future running of our schools.
- The normal procedure of involving the community and parents in the interview process for the new post in this instance was completely sidestepped, thus removing the sense of participation and partnership that is so important to The Highland Council and the communities involved.

It should also be noted that there are still serious ongoing problems regarding Additional Support Needs and Pupil Support Assistants where the education of our children is being compromised by the lack of provision of these important roles. Also, following the retirement of our school secretary Sandie Young, there is at the time of writing, no evidence of the Council trying to recruit for this post. None of these issues seem to be at the forefront of the

Education Department's actions despite having a serious adverse effect on the quality of education being given to our children.



COMMUNITY COMPANY NEWS

We have been informed that Lochaber Energy Group (LEG) have registered for the FITS payment scheme on the Glenachulish Hydro Scheme. The Community Company would like to wish them all the best in their venture.



Their scheme is in the early stages of process and the final outcome has

not been reached on the viability of the project. We have asked to be kept informed of the progress and offered our assistance with any information that may prove relevant In view of the Climate Emergency we feel we should support all community groups looking to ameliorate the effects and to that end we commend their efforts. The need for Communities to become more resilient and lower their carbon footprint will be a major issue to be met for Communities betterment.

In the future there could be a small financial benefit to the Community dependent on the outcome of LEG venture

HAMISH MACINNES - THE EARLY YEARS

When he was young, our local and world-renowned mountain-eering expert Hamish MacInnes lived at 31 Catherine Street. Gatehouse of Fleet in Kirkcudbrightshire. In the 1920s and 1930s his parents ran Market Cross Stores at 35-37 High Street.

After the Second World Hamish's War, his family moved to Gatehous Greenock on the Clyde. There Hamish became interested in mountaineering, learning accompanying a neighbour when he went climbing in the Arrochar Alps and by going out with the Glasgow Creag Dhu Club. When Hamish started climbing, it was mostly a hobby of the well-to-do, but the club allowed working class men to enjoy the sport too. The rest, as they say, is history.



CLAN LANDS

If you were out and about in Glencoe at the weekend, you may have spotted some celebrities...

Glencoe Folk Museum were thrilled to welcome Sam Heughan and Graham McTavish on Saturday, as they embarked on their first day of filming for 'Clan Lands', an upcoming show exploring the history and culture of the Scottish clans. The Outlander stars got up close and personal with some of the museum's Jacobite objects – including a pistol from Culloden Battlefield and a bible belonging to the MacDonald Chiefs - and chatted to staff and volunteer Jimmy the Bush about the history of the museum and the area.



The museum's curator, Catriona Davidson,

said, "It is great that Sam and Graham will be bringing the fascinating history of Scotland and its clans to an international audience, and we are very excited to be involved. Outlander has already introduced so many people all over the world to a period of Scottish history that they had never heard of before, and we can't wait to see Clan Lands bring this to life even more."



As well as visiting the museum, the duo spent some time whisky tasting and listening to traditional Scottish music at the Clachaig Inn, before chatting to NTS archaeologist Derek Alexander about recent excavations in the glen.

Clan Lands will air sometime in 2020.
